Learning from Photos—Food for Thought by Sarah Kraft

With National's come and gone, many of us are receiving fun ring shots – or if we were extra lucky – fun win photo's from the "big show". These are great opportunities to study our grooming techniques to see what's working and where we'd like to see improvement. For these purposes, it is just as important to look at moving pictures as it is stacked ones, and in some cases, even more so! It is a lot easier to create a beautiful outline standing still than it is to maintain it on the move. Of course, your individual dogs structure has a big impact here as well – but we aim to highlight the positive with grooming and not accentuate weaknesses.

Start by evaluating your dogs overall outline in a stacked photo; are there lumps and bumps on the topline that you wish weren't there? What about the underline? Is it tidy, and accentuating your dogs outline? Or does he look like a caterpillar in the grass with no legs? Do all the lines blend together seamlessly? Or do they create a "harsh" or "barbered" appearance? Being a very honest critic of your grooming will help you identify points for improvement, or areas you may want to ask for guidance on.

A few questions to ask yourself:


- What is the overall appearance of my dog?
- Are there areas that could be better accentuated? (Look specifically at the neck and shoulder blend, topline, tail set ...)
- Are there areas that needed more hair left on to create a smoother blend?
 (Same areas as above.)
- How do my dogs hocks look in profile? Do they accentuate the positives in the rear angulation?
- Does the underline look seamless with smooth blending?

When evaluating moving pictures, you do have to take into consideration the quality of the photo. If the photo freezes your dog in an awkward position just as you were pulling back on the lead – that maybe isn't the best photo to evaluate. But a series of gaiting photos that are reasonably good shots are a great tool to see what the judge is seeing when you move your dog. When looking at photos on the down and back, check the hocks – are they flopping? Or creating the illusion that your dog is close in the rear (or closer than he may be)? From both rear and front angles, look at the front leg feathering – does it need to be stripped to remove bulk so that it doesn't appear as if your dog is moving wide? Or to showcase the beautiful straight reach of the front legs? Is the volume of chest coat interfering with seeing the

movement of the front legs?

Evaluating from the side, it is important to look at the topline and tail set. If you have been aggressive with over-trimming the top coat – this is where you will see it! A Springer is supposed to round gently in the croup as it drives off its rear, but this can be over accentuated if your dog has a low tail set, and too much hair removed. The same is true for the middle of the back – most dogs have a bit of flexibility there, and leaving too much hair can result in a flopping or bouncing mound of hair; while removing too much coat can give the appearance of a dippy topline (or accentuate that weakness.)

Sweetie - My heart dog from the very beginning. We bonded from the very moment she was born. Sweetie was the first dog that was truly MY dog. After a very rough start she became my best friend and my teacher. She's given me so many gifts over the years...

She was the first dog I've ever tried to train; and while she had earned her CD (Becoming TCVESSA's High Scoring Novice Dog in 2002) and her RN and her RA (she earned her RA just a few months ago at the age of 13) she really could have done so much more. We even started tracking at the age of 12, but never quite got there. Had her trainer been half as good as she was.....

But, she loved to "work" right up until the end. She'd taken to gathering up the dog dishes and dropping them on my feet if I work the younger two and not her! She has let me "dress her up" in utterly embarrassing costumes to raise money for ESRA the last three years at the Twin Cities Pet Expo. She earned over \$600, "begging" with a basket in her mouth over those years.

Sweetie spent several years doing therapy work at a local hospital and visiting home hospice patients. She had an amazing ability to know what people needed and she gladly gave it to them. One of my favorite stories is when visiting at a local hospital a teacher asked us to step into a room where they were working with a young boy that had been in a car accident. They put his hand on the backs of a few Golden Retrievers that were with us and the teacher dragged his hand down their backs. Then I lifted Sweetie up so he could reach her. They placed his hand on her back and before they could move his hand he grasped her fur, he let go and grasped her again. His mother cried out loud. I looked up and asked what that was about. The teacher said that it was the first voluntary response he'd made since the accident. The child was the focus of a local news story a few months later and was walking in the story.

Sweetie never met a person, or a dog, that she didn't love. She truly lived up to her name. She got me through some very rough times over the years and brought me much laughter with her antics – what more can you ask for in a dog? She gave me her heart and her soul and asked for very little in return (mostly just good snacks and a scritch on the butt).

She spent years posing for me. My beautiful "spotted dog". She had the most lovely eyes, a wonderful spaniel expression. Whatever I wanted her to wear, however I wanted her to sit or stand or lay – she did it most willingly. She is the subject in my "Bitch on a Birch" photo (Thanks Jack B.!) for which I've won many awards.

She's passed these wonderful traits onto her two daughters. Another gift, for which I'm grateful.

Amazingly, she gave me one more gift – While in Chicago for a seminar I received a phone call at 10p last Sunday night. Sweetie was acting "funny" wouldn't get up and

was lethargic. She was taken the emergency vet while I packed up and headed home. An hour into the drive I got the news – Most



likely cancer, liver and lungs. And, she probably wouldn't make it through the night. There was a slight possibility that the lung disease was fungal. For that reason we chose to take her to the U of MN for further work up - I have other dogs, and felt I needed to know if she picked up a fungus somewhere. Also, selfishly, I really wanted to see her alive once more. I drove through the night and made it to the U at 5a. She was in the ICU in an O2 "crate" and didn't seem to know me. They did an ultrasound later that morning and biopsied the tumors. It was cancer, liver, lungs, gall bladder - most likely elsewhere, too. After we received the news they wheeled her in on little red wagon. She seemed much more like herself. Started walking a bit, got "pushy" about being petted, drank some water. They urged us to euthanize her that day. They felt that she wouldn't survive the car ride home. Looking into her eyes, however, I couldn't do it. I've put other dogs down, and while I've never

been happy about it I've always felt comfortable that it was the right time. This just didn't feel right. I took her home with me.

When we got home she trotted into the garage and waited at the top of the steps to be let in the house, scratching the door in her impatience to get inside.

We had 4 extra days together. We ate some good snacks and did a lot of snuggling. She didn't eat anything on Friday and became very unsteady on her feet. So, this morning I sent her to the bridge.

My heart, my companion, my browned eyed girl; I'll miss you so.

toes dipping in the dead calm lake; the starshine dim through a cloudy veil the night breeze soft upon my face; listening to the loon's haunting wail.


As I watch a single star fall-I feel so lonely, so small.
