#### **TCVESSA Board Meeting Minutes: February 18, 2013**

The meeting via teleconference was called to order at 6:36 PM by Francie Nelson.

**Secretary's report:** The notes, from the January 14, 2013, Board meeting were read. A motion to accept them was made, seconded, and approved.

A second reading for a new membership application for Debbie and Dale May was heard. A motion to accept their membership application was made, seconded, and approved.

A letter from the AKC where they have approved our club for agility events was read. Kathy Patregnani will call the AKC to clarify a point.

**Treasurer's report:** It was reported that an amount of \$4,267.07 was in the club's account. We profited \$65.00 from the A-Agility match held in January at On the Run Canine Center in Ham Lake, MN.

**Specialty:** Liz Pike reported that she is still waiting on a couple of approvals from the AKC. Lori Ericson will be our photographer for the Specialty. Steve Maynard requested that he be released from his contract and perhaps move him to 2016 because he will be judging at National. It was motioned to postpone his selection, seconded, and approved. Liz has not heard from the gentleman for electrical and catering.

**Banquet:** Carmen Laing reported that the Annual Banquet has received reservations for 22 people so far. Francie will create a reminder for the club's members.

**Agility:** Kathy Patregnani reported that the A-Agility Match in January was a success. She would like to order ribbons for the June Agility trial so she will order them and bill the club. 300 Q ribbons and combined New Title and Double Q ribbons will total approximately \$500.00. There was a consensus among the board members to purchase these ribbons. We have to split the income from this trial with the AKC, 50/50, but this is the last time we have to split the profits with them.

The 2014 Agility match is scheduled for May 30, 31, and June 1, 2014.

Kathy Patregnani proposed to submit paperwork to the AKC for a trial in October 2013 which would be \$300.00. There isn't a provisional judge available, though. She knows of a local judge who would give us a discount for \$125.00 for 110 runs on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday. There was a consensus from the board members to accept this proposition.

Kathy Patregnani proposed another agility trial in January 2014 for the 24<sup>th</sup>, 25<sup>th</sup>, and 26<sup>th</sup>. St Paul Training Center is available and she has asked a local judge to preside.

Initially it was postponed because of the cost to apply but later, the board members agreed to apply since other clubs were applying for agility events and there were few open week-ends available in 2014. Jon offered to pay for the application fee and will be reimbursed by the club when funds become available.

**Sunshine Coordinator:** Maryevelyn Monty sent sympathy cards to family members of Agnes Willms, a long time TCVESSA member.

The next meeting will be Monday, March 25, 2013, at Byerly's in Maple Grove in the open area restaurant. The following meeting devoted to the Specialty will be held at Liz Pike's home on Sunday, April 28, 2013, at 2:00 PM.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:28 PM.

#### THE ORIGIN AND HISTORY OF SPANIELS AND SPANIEL BREED STANDARDS

SHE IS APPROVED TO JUDGE ENGLISH SPRINGERS (AND THREE OTHER SPORTING BREEDS) IN THE US AND WAS THE FIRST US CITIZEN TO BE INVITED TO JUDGE THE BREED – AND AWARD CHALLENGE CERTIFICATES – IN ITS COUNTRY OF ORI-GIN, ENGLAND.

# Ancient Spaniel History: Uncertain.

How did our breed, and our breed standard, come about, once dogs of spaniel type arrived in the British Isles?

The true origin of spaniels is not known, but their ancient lineage, and their service and function as one of the finest upland game hunting breeds, is many centuries old. Some spaniel scholars claim Spain as the country responsible for spaniels, citing the breed's name as an indicator of its origin. But the domestic dog is now known to have originated in Asia, so all migration of *canis domesticus* into Europe would have come from East to West. Interestingly, dogs of spaniel type are more likely to be found in artwork of Northern Europe, *not* Spain. Equally interesting, the word "span" is of Old Germanic origin and at one time referred to a pair of animals working in tandem (a brace of hunting **span**-iels, perhaps?). That Old Germanic word migrated into Old English with the arrival of the Anglo- Saxons. Perhaps they brought their **span**-iels with them.

# Spaniels from the 18<sup>th</sup> Century Forward: The British Isles.

From the late 18<sup>th</sup> century to the mid-19<sup>th</sup> century there were, essentially, three sorts of spaniels. There was the "land" spaniel, the "water" spaniel, and the "carpet spaniel." Land spaniels pursued game over land. Water spaniels retrieved game from water. Carpet spaniels were small foot-warmers that were companions to peers and royalty, though they retained some hunting instincts and abilities (and they still do). Land spaniels were bi-or-tri-colored (though there are references to solid colors as well as solids with tan, cited as evidence of terrier crosses); water spaniels were either solid or bi-colored. 19<sup>th</sup> century selection moved the water spaniels toward the solid colors we know today.

# Geography: How a Rich Variety of Spaniels Developed.

Travel – whether over land or over water – was difficult and time consuming. Therefore, varieties within breeds developed regionally. The land spaniel on *your* English estate could look quite different from the land spaniel on *my* English estate. For example, spaniels developed on the estate of the Duke of Norfolk were known as "Norfolk Spaniels." Spaniels from Sussex were known as "Sussex Spaniels." Spaniels from the estate of the Earl of Clumber were known as Clumber Spaniels. "Springer" and "cocker" were terms that described the hunting functions of each. "Field spaniel" was a generic term that described them all.
